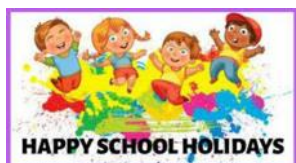

## DEPUTY NEWS

### Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability in 2022



Falls Road Primary School is required to complete the 'Nationally Consistent Collection of Data' (NCCD) for school students with a disability.

The Collection aims to provide all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students with additional needs in schools and the adjustments they require to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students. The Collection is an annual process for schools.

This process will involve the collection of the following information:

- The number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education
- The level of adjustment provided to students; and
- Where known, the student's type of disability.

The definition of 'disability' is broad and includes learning difficulties, health conditions and mental health illnesses.

Once the data has been collated, it will be de-identified and forwarded to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training. This ensures anonymity. The data is used by our school to inform and improve practice for students with additional needs.

**Your child's involvement in the process is optional.**

### Year 4 Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) Testing

The PEAC testing for Falls Road Year 4 students will take place on Wednesday, 27 July. If students in Year 4 are away on this day, there will be opportunities for catch-up testing over the next week.

The PEAC testing is a South Metropolitan Education District testing program that is used to identify the top 2% of students through Mathematical Reasoning and Verbal Reasoning assessments. The students who are identified through this process will then be offered places in the PEAC Program in Year 5 and Year 6.

**NOTE: If you do not want your Year 4 child to take part in the Year 4 PEAC testing, please notify the school in writing prior to Wednesday, 27 July (email or note).**

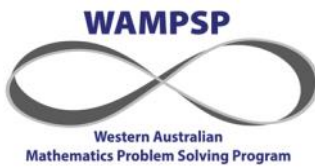
